

INADEQUATE CLASSROOM SIZE

Classrooms are crowded, don't provide flexible learning spaces and are too small (specifically 500 sq. ft. too small) for contemporary 21st century learning.



TOWN MASTER PLAN RECOMMENDATION

Based on the Wilmington Facilities Master Plan (2018), to save money and create a more effective school system, it was recommended to consolidate the towns elementary schools, including the Wildwood Early Childhood Center.



AGE OF SCHOOL

Constructed in 1955 with NO renovations or additions in those 67 years. Ongoing operations of the existing school will need to continue since the project partnership with the MSBA can take up to 7 years to complete.



ADDITIONAL CONCERNS

- Original windows and doors are 67 years old
- Heating system is inconsistent, inefficient and unreliable



PROJECT TO PURSUE WITH MSBA

The Massachusetts School Building Authority offers a competitive grant program, in which Wilmington was invited to apply out of 71 interested communities. Their grants focus on capital improvement projects for public schools; like those accomplished at the high school.



What's a Feasibility Study?


